4TH INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM ON

MUSIC THERAPY AND ADOLESCENTS

Various Approaches in Different Contexts: Differentiation and Bridges

Munich 28 – 29 October 2017

The subject of the symposium is the presentation, reflection and discussion of various approaches to music therapy with adolescents under different foci, including target groups, treatment goals, contexts, regions and the history of music therapy development in different countries. The aim of the symposium will be to scope similarities and differences and to build bridges between the various approaches for further development of music therapy and adolescent practice, based on theoretical and methodological discussions.

The symposium includes lectures and discussions on Saturday (max. 120 participants) and two practical workshops on Sunday (max. 70 participants).
